LA GRANDE

Few passengers over the O. R. & N. railroad will ever forget the fact that they at one time passed thru La Grande. From either side dropping out of the mountains into one of the most beautiful panoramic scenes, spreads out the Grande Ronde valley.

But there is much to be seen from the car window, aside from the sentimentality of the surroundings. The homeseeker from the East upon winding down the mountain side above Union station is presented a scene that the best writers in America have attempted to fittingly describe. Just about the time the train-

men announces "next station is La Grande" the train dashes by the large Hot Lake Sanatorium which is a wonder itself. A few minutes more the large polls and the heavy transmission wires of the G. R. E. Co., suggest commercialism of the highest order, then the mill and elevator of the La Grande Flouring mill, then burst into view the large buildings on the stately elevation, which upon inquiry, the passerby learns that one of the large brick buildings is the temple of justice, which suggestion causes the realization of the fact that La Grande is the county seat. The other buildings are easily recognized as buildings of education and the many church spires plainly tell their story. On the opposite side of the car the large sugar factory stands out as a monument of industry. The planting mills, the warehouses, a crowded depot, with its stir and bustle. The round house, machine shop, coal bunkers, train dispatchers office, freight division, large yards with long trains of freight cars. Then as the train proceeds the stock pens add their testimony to our live stock industry, the smoke from the pumping station, the large new building, of the Palmer Lumber Co., The brick yards, the dam and power plant at Oro Dell.

Then, when the mountains are once more encircled and the passenger has settled for another sameness in scenery the large lumber plant of the Grande Ronde Lumber Company comes into view. There is not another twenty miles of scenery and evidence of permanent industrial activity as this twenty miles from the time this valley is first viewed until the mountains are entered at Perry.

La Grande being the educational, industrial, financial, and political center an impression is naturally impressed upon the mind of every one passing thru our city. All of which cannot but be of great benefit.

"MY COUNTRY"

The author of the words of "America" Samuel Francis Smith, who died a few years ago, received the following eulogy from his Harvard classmate, Dr. Oliver Wendell Holmes.

"Now, there's Smith. His name will be honored by every school child in the land, when I have been forgotten a hundred years. He wrote, 'My Country 'Tis of Thee.' If he had said 'Our Country' the hymn would not have been immortal, but that 'my' was a master stroke. Every one who sings the hymn at once, feels a personal ownership in his native land.

The hymn will last as long as the country." It is of him that Holmes says in his poem entitled "The Boys."

"And there's a nice fellow of excellent pith, Fate tried to conceal by naming him Smith

But he shouted a song for the brave and free Just read on his medal "My Country 'Tis of Thee?"

In a letter dated, Newton Centre, Mass., June 11, 1861, Dr. Smith said, "The song was written at Andover during my student life there, I think in the winter of 1831-2. It was first publicly used at a Sunday School celebration on July 4th, in the Park Street church, Boston. I had in my possession a quantity of German song books from which I was selecting such music as pleased me, and finding "God Save the King" I proceeded to give it the ring of American republican patriotism."
