THE NEWS FORECAST OF THE WEEK

(Scripps News Association)
Washington, Feb. 9.—The case of Representative Binger Hermann of Oregon, who is charged with the destruction of certain letter press copybooks when he retired from the office of commissioner of the general land office, will come up for trial in the district criminal court on Monday.

The school section of the class of 1907, United States Naval Academy, will be graduated at Annapolis Monday. Secretary Metcalf will deliver the diplomas to the graduates.

Many visitors and tourists will flock to the South during the week to attend the annual Mardi Gras celebrations in New Orleans and in Mobile, Pensacola and Natchez.

The interstate commerce commission has fixed Monday as the date for resuming the investigation into the financial methods of the Harriman corporations in New York.

Tuesday the anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln will be observed throughout the country in the customary manner. King Edward will open Parliament with full state ceremonial on Tuesday.

The thirty-first annual bench show of the Westminster Kennel Club will open Tuesday in Madison Square Garden, New York, and continue through the week.

The National American Woman Suffrage Association will begin its thirty-ninth annual convention in Chicago Thursday.

Michigan Republicans will assemble in state convention at Grand Rapids Thursday to name two candidates for justice of the supreme court, two candidates for regent of the state university, and a candidate for member of the state board of education.

A motion is to be argued at Findlay, Ohio, Friday to quash the indictments recently found against John D. Rockefeller, the Standard Oil Company and its subsidiary concerns.

Four men, three whites and one negro, are to pay the penalty on the gallows in Kentucky Friday for crimes they have committed. Two of the men are to die for criminal assault, and two for murder.
