

THE OSTEOPATHIC BILL

The Osteopathic bill seems to be one of the great bones of quiet contention in the legislature this session, consequently a synopsis of the measure will be of interest. The bill calls for an examining board of five holding office four years each to be appointed by the governor. Said board is self supporting and no charge upon the state. It requires preliminary educational qualification equal to a diploma from a high school or academy, or entrance certificate to a literary or scientific college. It provides for a thorough examination in anatomy, physiology, physiological chemistry, toxicology, diagnosis, hygiene, obstetrics, gynecology, minor surgery and principles and practice of osteopathy. It requires three years of nine months each study in any of the nine osteopathic colleges to qualify for this examination. It provides for the registration of osteopaths now in practice. It prohibits Osteopaths from giving drugs or performing surgery.

construed as to interfere with or prevent the practice of massage, Swedish movement, physical culture, neuropathy, chiropractic, naturopathy, or other natural methods requiring the use of the hand or hands; provided, that such person or persons do not violate the provisions of section 7 of this act by calling themselves osteopaths. The Osteopaths ask that they be examined by their own board the same as the drug doctors, dentists, etc. Osteopathy has been declared by numerous supreme courts to not be the practice of medicine. They are forbidden to use drugs, so why should they be examined by a medical board, they ask. The senate of the United States passed a similar bill this session, and twenty-six states have enacted laws regulating its practice. Why should there be opposition? Is the question that is causing the Osteopaths and their friends to wonder.—Salem Statesman.

HAHN TO COMPETE

Norfolk, Va., Feb. 13—Word has recently been received at the Athletic Bureau of the Jamestown Ter-Centennial Exposition, to be held on the shores of Hampton Roads, near Norfolk, from April 26th to Nov. 30th, that Archie Hahn, the famous little sprinter of the Milwaukee Athletic Club, will compete in the Amateur Athletic Union's Championship meet in the Exposition Stadium, in September, in the endeavor to add fresh laurels to his already long list. Hahn has had a singularly successful career on the cinder-path, coming into prominence some years ago as a member of the University of Michigan Track team, where he captured several Western and other championships.

In the national A. A. U. championships of 1905, held in Milwaukee, he carried off the honors in the 100 yd., and 220 yd., dashes and the next year at the St. Louis Games he added the 60, 100 and 200 meter races, making the first in 7 seconds in March 1906 he ran the 75 yd. dash in world record time, 7 3-8 seconds, and in August of the same year at the Portland Exposition he added his last and greatest triumph, his victory over the world's greatest sprinters at Athens last spring at the Olympic Games in the 100 meter championship race.

At the last National Championships, held in New York, Hahn competed, but owing to poor conditions, was defeated. This changed his determination to retire from athletics, and he will be seen at his best during the Athletic Games at the Jamestown Ter-Centennial Exposition, which takes place in September.
