SPOKANE BY WAY OF UMATILLA

The first O. R. & N. train to leave Pendleton for Spokane during the month of February will leave Thursday morning at 9 o'clock, by way of Umatilla, says the Pendleton E. O.

The track of the Washington division has been sufficiently repaired to enable the O. R. & N. company to use that portion of the system and No. 8, the Spokane train, will be run Thursday.

This train will carry passengers, express, baggage and mail and will leave there in charge of Conductor Patton. About three carloads of mail, express, baggage and mail will be carried for Walla Walla, Dayton and Milton, but nothing destined this side of Milton will be carried.

NO FIGHT OVER OSTEOPATHY

Salem, Or., Feb. 12.—(Special.)—The expected fight over the osteopathy bill did not materialize in the Senate this morning, though the bill had been made a special order for 10 a. m. When the bill came up Senator Nottingham moved to have it referred to the committee on revision of laws, and, in doing so, took occasion to throw a dart at the committee on medicine and pharmacy, which had reported a substitute for the bill introduced by Nottingham.

The fighting Senator from Multnomah said that he had learned from the Attorney-General that the substitute bill contained unconstitutional provisions, as he predicted it would when the original was referred to the committee on medicine. He said this is the case with everything that falls into the hands of its enemies. His motion to send the bill to the committee on revision of laws carried without dissent.—Oregonian.
