**FAST MAIL WILL LIKELY BE PUT IN SERVICE SOON**

A thru and fast mail train between Salt Lake and Portland is the newest topic of discussion among employes of the railroad. The rumor cannot be authenticated in La Grande as definite instructions has of course not yet been issued.

O. R. & N. officials have not given out any information but from headquarters of the Harriman lines at Chicago comes the report that such a train is seriously considered, and to make the rumor all the more interesting, comes the report that by March first of this year the train will be in force. However as it takes double the allotted time for such schemes and proposition to materialize, it is safe to say, that should the train be put in force at all, it will not be until late spring. The additional services was instigated by the expected thousands of homeseekers and tourists that will take advantage of the reduced rates westward, coming into effect on March first.

It is thot that this increased travel will add further to the delays to the present service, and in order to make connection with the mail and deliver it to Portland on scheduled time, that a special mail train will be absolutely necessary.

Such a train is now run from Chicago to Los Angeles and San Francisco and Portland demands the same service. The Portland train would leave Salt Lake after the arrival of No 9, the Los Angeles mail train daily, and would afford the O. R. & N. a service equal to any other portion of the Harriman system.

If the Portland-Salt Lake mail train is placed in service on the Oregon Short Line and O. R. & N., it will carry but four or five cars, including mail and express, one or two Pullmans and buffet. It will make but few stops and will be favored in every way in making time with its burden of mail.

O. R. & N. employes are already discussing the promotions. The Pendleton East Oregonian, in speaking of the proposed train, says that Conductors Coykendall and Waffle, now on the Pendleton-Huntington passenger runs, will be the ones promoted to this run.

Lumber from Perry	\$1.50 per thousand
Lumber from Summerville	\$3.50 per thousand
For hauling sand	\$1.00 per yard
For hauling gravel	\$1.00 per yard

The size of jump boards is to be 10 feet long, 12 inches deep. For plowing, \$2 per acre or fraction thereof. For excavation with scraper 25c for dirt, 30c for gravel. Scavenger work to be \$1 per load.

Every man belonging to their union shall be subject to a fine of \$5 for the first offence and if he refuses to pay the fine, the rest to quit the job.
