# A CLUB HOUSE FOR EMPLOYES

Following the lead of the Southern Pacific and one or two other lines, the Oregon Short Line has decided upon the erection of a series of trainmen's clubs at various points on its lines for the comfort and convenience of the unmarried men amongst its employes.

These clubs are intended to take the place of the present poorly equipped hotels at the various railroad divisions and other points, which are in many cases entirely inadequate to provide for the growing needs of the army of trainmen in search of accommodations for periods of from one night to three or four days. A brakeman, engineer or conductor arriving at the end of his run or the point from which he is expected to take out another train frequently finds himself compelled to wait several hours. He is in many cases forced to put up with wretched accommodations at a high price and it is to remedy this state of affairs that the Oregon Short Line has decided upon the erection of its own quarters.
