NEGRO MOLENOX GETS DECISION IN SIX ROUNDS

Was the prize fight last evening a fiasco? Yes and no. It was no fault of the management of the event, and it was no fault of the referee. Just where the fault lies is too much of a personal opinion to be discussed in press. Briefly told Moleno, the coon, was in a class far above the realm of the white man. A little later than advertised, the contestants took their corners. The coon chewed gum right lustily while Jack Darnell was a trifle excited. The men shook hands and the gong sounded. George Bernie won two points out of three in a fencing match with Professor Christol. The exhibition was instructive to those who have not seen the system whereby the fencing contests are arranged.

Crippled Shipping Facilities Hamper The Construction

The pleasant weather has seen instrumental in hurrying the construction of the new round house. But for delays in shipment of material, the three-ply tar roof would now have been complete. A carload of paper is now here and when the tar arrives, and weather permits, workmen will put on the roof. The tar will be heated and applied to the roof boards previously covered with three-ply tar paper. While yet hot the gravel will be rubbed in. This system makes a perfect water shed. On the inside of the rear wall, Contractor Wiggers is constructing conduit, five by five feet in size. In this canal will be hung all the pipes running hot water, air and cold water. From these mains will

be run terra cotta six-inch pipes to the pit in each stall. Within the terra cotta pipes will be lead pipes carrying the hot and cold water to the pits. A new and desirable feature about the new water system is that, pits will be equipped with hot water for washing the boilers. This means the illumination of much delay for under the present condition the boilers are washed with cold water, which means that the boilers must be cooled before they can be washed. Then when the engine boilers are to be refilled, hot water can be turned into them. This means a saving of both time and coal, as it is evident that it makes less heat to bring hot water to boiling point.
