

This is well enough until they attempt to hedge themselves about with special privileges, supposed to be conferred by diplomas given from certain schools. Hence when a man with with rising choler and bitter denunciation seeks to prevent others who do not see things as he sees them in the reaim of therapeutics, from practicing the science of healing, either by the administration of drugs, by manipulation of the patient's body, by a system of dietetics or by the process known as mental healing, he assumes an attitude of intolerance and of persecution that is wholly at variance with the enlightened spirit of the age.
