THE NEWS FORECAST OF COMING WEEK

Washington, D. C. Feb. 23—The Interstate Commerce Commission will meet in New York Monday to conduct a further inquiry into the operations of the Harriman Railroad interests. President E. H. Harriman and many other witnesses will be heard.

The members of the superintendents' department of the National Educational Association will assemble in Chicago the first of the week for their annual conference.

The one hundredth anniversary of the poet, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, will be observed in many parts of the country Wednesday. Especially noteworthy celebrations will be held in Portland, Me. and Cambridge, Mass., with which cities the life of the poet is most closely connected.

The Minnesota, one of the largest class of American battleships so far put in service will be delivered to the Government at the Norfolk navy yard next Wednesday. Democrats of Michigan will meet in state convention at Flint next Thursday to name candidates for justice of the supreme court and regents of the state university.

The fourteenth annual Sportman's show will open in Madison Square Garden, New York, next Friday and continue for one week.

Congress will doubtless put in a very busy week as it will be the final stretch of the session, which will expire by limitation on March 4. There is any quantity of business awaiting attention, but the limited time will give the leaders a good excuse for confining themselves to the necessary appropriation measures. The chances of anything else getting through appear almost hopeless.
