FROM BALTIMORE TO SEATTLE

(Scripps News Association)
Baltimore, Md., Feb. 25—The United States coast and geodetic survey service steamer Explorer, which has been fitting out here for some time past, is now ready to start on her 17,000 mile trip to Seattle, where she will take the place of the steamer Gedney, whose days of usefulness are said to be over. The trip will be made by way of the Straits of Magellan, and it is expected it will occupy about 125 days. On the way a number of stops will be made for coal. The Explorer is a new ship, having been built at Wilmington, Del., two years ago, but she has been given a general overhauling and put in trim for her long voyage on stormy seas. Capt. W. C. Dibrell will command the ship on her long voyage.
