ROADS BAD TO WALLOWA COUNTY.

Travelers from over the Wallowa way are a unit in their declaration that the roads were awful. E. W Rumble, the manager of the stage line, says that in the five years he has been doing business on that line, the roads were never so bad.

The mail roads between the post offices of Flora and Bartlett in north Wallowa are so filled with debris caused by slides of rock and snow that they are impassable except to pedestrians or those on horse-back.
