# CONGRESSMAN ELLIS TALKS IN HIS HOME TOWN

While in the city from the national capital, Congressman Ellis talks entertainingly of conditions in congress and the prospect for legislation during the present session, says the Pendleton East Oregonian. Among the laws which he feels will likely be passed this session is the postal savings bank law by which small depositors may use the postoffice as a depository and thus have the guarantee of the government back of their funds.

Postmaster General George von Meyer is an ardent advocate of the law and is urging it before congress with all the force at his command. Many leading congressmen have been won over to the measure and it is the opinion of Congressman Ellis that it will be passed at this session unless legislation becomes complicated in some way.

As to the prospects for legislation for the northwest, Congressman Ellis says that it is too early in the session to make any predictions. Practically nothing but organization was effected before the holiday vacation and after congress resumes next Monday the session will get down to actual work and results will follow.

As to the financial flurry, he says that there are almost as many opinions as there are congressmen and while there is a strong sentiment in favor of some radical legislation by which a more expansive currency may be furnished the country, yet there is no distinct outline of a plan by which the condition may be met.

Aside from a few factories which have slightly reduced their force, there is no noticeable effect of the panic, and it is the general sentiment all through the east as far as he has been able to observe, that all conditions will soon be normal again, although there is a feeling that the approach of a presidential election may have some effect in continuing a slight depression in certain lines.

Congressman Ellis represents one of the largest districts of any man in congress, the second district of Ore-

gon consisting of 16 large counties and comprising about 55,000 square miles. When he tells his eastern colleagues of the immense size and varied interests of his district, much genuine surprise is expressed. In many instances congressmen of his acquaintance are able to walk around the borders of their district before breakfast where the district is composed of some single ward in one of the large cities.

All the northwest delegates are working strenuously for river improvements but it is too early in the session to make a guess as to the outcome of their efforts as it is the general belief that there will be much filibustering and skirmishing in congress by both parties, owing to the approach of the presidential election. However, this belief is based on the action of former sessions under similar circumstances rather than upon any apparent tendency along these lines in the present session.
