### SELF DEFENSE.

Will Be the Plea of Ben West of Baker City.

The regular panel was exhausted this morning in the case of the State against Ben West, and a special venire of 15 men was summoned. The jury had not been completed at 2 o'clock but it is expected that all the men will be secured today and the introduction of testimony will begin tomorrow. Six jurors were secured from the regular panel and no trouble was anticipated in securing the others. There was some trouble with the jurors on account of the belief of some who do not want to inflict the death penalty. Lomax and Anderson have charge of the case for the state, while John L. Rand and W. H. Strayer are counsel for the defendant. West will plead self-defense for the killing of Millard J. Donnelly at Cornucopia on November 17, and the case will be hard fought from start to finish.—Baker City Herald.

### A PIONEER PRIEST.

Rt. Rev. John Heinrich, vicar general of the diocese of Baker City, passed peacefully away at St. Elizabeth's hospital at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, surrounded by Bishop C. J. O'Reilly and the local clergy of the cathedral parish. The funeral will be held Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock from the pro-cathedral and it is expected that a large delegation of the clergy will be present and assist at the services. The Very Rev. A. A. Gronsgwest of The Dalles, will sing the mass and Rt. Rev. Bishop O'Reilly will deliver the eulogy of the departed.

Father Heinrich was one of the oldest and best known priests in the northwest and had lived in Oregon consecutively for 38 years. He was born in Austria 60 years ago and took his philosophical and theological studies at the American college at Louvain, Belgium. He came to Portland with Archbishop Blanchet and was ordained a priest of the arch-diocese of Oregon. He was connected with the cathedral in Portland and was also superintendent of St. Michael's college for boys for several years. For 18 years he was stationed in Roseburg and the territory adjoining. Afterwards he served for several years as pastor of St. Francis church in East Portland and later on was appointed as superintendent of St. Mary's home for orphans at Beaverton, Ore.

Of late years he has been stationed in Baker City, where he was esteemed and loved by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance.
