Baker County Will Have No More Wooden Culverts.

Yesterday the county court ordered a carload of corrugated steel to be used in the construction of culverts throughout the county. This is considered a wise move by those who have had occasion to take notice of the expense the wooden culverts have been, says the Baker City Herald.

There is no doubt about the impossibility of being able to keep wooden culverts in repair for the freight wagons strain them no matter how solid they may be constructed. With the corrugated steel nothing will be necessary only to make the grade, and they have a guaranteed life of 50 years.

The court ordered 8, 12, 18, 24 and a few 30-inch sizes. Deal & Co. of Portland, will furnish the goods and the cost of the carload will be in the neighborhood of \$1200.

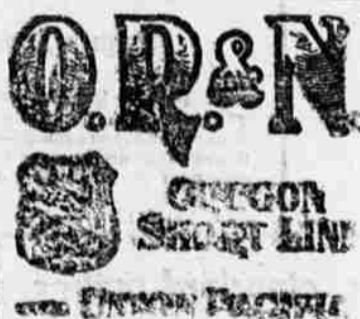
