BISHOP PADDOCK

Rt. Rev. Robert Paddock, the new Episcopal bishop of eastern Oregon, in a sermon delivered this week in New York City, in speaking of the personal responsibility of Christians, said:
 "God calls some men to be lawyers whose duty it shall be to see that wise laws are enacted and justice done, as certain as does others to preach the gospel. He teaches some men also to be physicians, to heal the sick; and by methods of His own, but by the use of men—the same plan He follows in converting Africa and Asia. It is a miracle just as truly as were the miracles recorded in the gospel. He calls some men to make money—a million it may be, in one case, a thousand in another. Whatever difference there may be between the men who make those two sums is God-given, and the million men should realize that fact and live accordingly.
 "The ideal to be aimed at is that the men capable of accumulating a million dollars or doing heroic deeds, or discovering new things, shall realize their stewardship, not only of their talents, but also of accumulations arising from these talents."

"DEVIL'S AUCTION" COMING.
 Steward's Opera House Tuesday, January 17.

Charles H. Yale's "Everlasting Devil's Auction," which by virtue of its capacity to keep abreast of the times has earned the sobriquet preceding its title, is now playing en tour to audiences that has history to consider in viewing the production that has out-lived almost everything else except Shakespeare and "Uncle Tom's Cabin."
 Twenty-six years ago when James S. Moffett and his partner, Bartholomew, were involved in the telling of the story they ran the show with gas light and tallow dips and flash boxes, and when electricity began to be used the scheme of giving the show was changed to keep abreast of the times and newer conditions. The title underwent the same sort of brushing up until there was nothing left but Everlasting to describe its quality.
 In all these years the "Devil's Auction" has gone ahead supplying the amusement public with a couple of hours of anticipated pleasure, until its announcements have gained a sort of importance so that events are dated from its coming and going, and a reward for good behavior held out to young folks, that they will be taken to see the "Everlasting Devil's Auction" if they are good. If they are not, well—they don't go, and many a youngster is on the qui vive from the day the town walls are adorned with "Auction" pictures until they know how their fate is settled.
 This year's edition, the 26th, as in every succeeding season, new costumes, scenery and the latest novelties are conspicuous in this production.

MANY SAMPLES.
 Many Localities Think They Have the Kind of Sand Wanted.

All kinds of sand are being sent into the Commercial club of this city, from the interior, in the hope that it may prove "silica sand," advertised for by that body. The stuff comes in bottles, bags, phials, loose in letters, and in neat packages, by express. It comes from southern and eastern Oregon, as well as from Washington, Idaho, Montana and northern California. Each sample is submitted to the Columbia Steel works for inspection and the corporation will report progress later on.
 A reward of \$100 has been offered by the steel company for a good sample of genuine silica sand, and promise of \$5 a ton for 100 tons a month after the specimen has been approved.
 But no one knows anything about what constitutes the sand they submit except the metallurgist of the company, and he is not ready to tell yet. People, therefore, who have even a sand bank on their ranches send a sample of it in hoping it may prove just the thing. One man sent in a chunk of sandstone, saying he had a whole mountain of it on his place in western Montana and that he was pretty sure it was just what the steel company needs in its business. An-

other, from northern Idaho, sent for samples in order to compare them with the sand he has on the shores of a mountain lake.
 Silica sand used in Portland now comes from Minnesota by the carload, and if the stuff can be found on the Pacific coast, it will save a lot of money in original cost as well as freight, besides paying the fortunate possessor, a handsome profit.
