## WILL LADD HELP IRRIGON SCHEME

The people of Irrigon are now agitated as the result of the failure of the Title Guarantee & Trust company of Portland, as that company has expended about \$350,000 in developing the Irrigon irrigation project and the town and the vacant lands are now a part of the wreckage of that failure. The Irrigon project was financed by J. Thornburn Ross, of the Title Guarantee & Trust company, and as W. M. Ladd has assumed all of the obligations of the defunct Trust company, the unsold land and the townsite becomes a part of the resources upon which Mr. Ladd will seek to recover the amount due depositors. There are 32,000 acres of land in the Irrigon project, 25,000 acres of

which are above the present ditch. The 7000 acres which are below the ditch has a perfect and abundant water supply and the land is worth at the very least \$100 per acre. On this land, alone, it is estimated by the people of Irrigon that \$700,000 can be raised toward recouping the trust company. There are about 25 miles of ditch and pipe line on the Irrigon project and by the construction of a few miles more of pipe line a large part of the present idle lands can be reclaimed. It is hoped by the people of Irrigon that Mr. Ladd takes hold of the Irrigon project to develop it fully and make it yield what it is really worth to the depositors of the trust company.

## ATTEMPTED ABDUCTION

### UNION GIRL SEIZED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS.

Miss Wakefield Has Narrow Escape From Unknown Assailant—Received Severe Bruises—Father Hears Her Cries for Help and Arrives on Scene in Time to Save Daughter.

Monday evening at about 8 o'clock, Miss Opal Wakefield, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. L. Wakefield, who lives in South Union, near the Episcopal church, was seized from the back porch of her home and pushed about 50 feet from the house, where she was dropped, her cries for help having frightened her assailant, who made his escape. Mr. Wakefield ran at once to his daughter's assistance and helped her to the house, where she was almost prostrated with fright. An alarm was at once sounded, and the city marshal and a large posse of citizens were promptly on the grounds, making a thorough search, but without avail, the assailant making his escape. Various theories are advanced in the case, but the solution seems yet far away. The young lady is about 13 years of age, had just stepped out upon the porch, and was pounced upon and forced away without warning.

Aside from some bruises and a severe nervous strain, Miss Wakefield was not injured. The city marshal is still working on the case and a solution may yet be found.—Union Republican.
