## SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS OUTNUMBER THE DAY SCHOOL

Considered in its district, county, state and international aspects all as one, the following facts will be of interest to many:  
There are 250,000 Sunday schools. The enrollment is about 26,000,000. The largest single organization in the world.  
On this continent there are 1,500,000 Sunday school teachers.  
There are three Sunday school teachers to every one day school teacher in the United States.  
The average pupils stays longer with his teacher in Sunday school than in day school.  
The world's most wonderful syndicate is the 15 men who are known as the "International Lesson Committee." They control the movements, in part, of nearly 26,000,000 of people. Yet they are not organized and receive no pay.

The total value of the Sunday school periodicals of the various publishing houses per annum is placed at \$500,000,000.  
The international lessons are used in India by about 500,000 in the Sunday schools. These 500,000 have among them 32 different languages.  
The biggest baseball league in the world is that in Chicago among the young men's Bible classes. It comprises 47 clubs. A condition of membership in each is membership and attendance on Bible classes in Sunday school.  
15,000 conventions are held annually, reaching and touching at least 2,500,000 workers.  
The interchange of fellowship through the organized Sunday school work has made possible the inter-church federation.

## BISHOP IS INDIGNANT

New York, Jan. 16.—Archbishop Farley of New York, who, it is rumored, may be made a cardinal at the next consistory, has definitely refused to perform the ceremony uniting Count Szechenyi and Miss Gladys Vanderbilt. He bases his refusal on his well known antipathy to the marriage of Catholics to Protestants. On many previous occasions he has set the seal of his disapproval on these alliances, and he has remained true to his convictions, despite the prominence of the contracting parties.  
The wedding of Szechenyi and Miss Vanderbilt, it is now said, will take place a week from Monday, January 27. The match was at one time broken off, owing, it is alleged, to financial reasons, but the disagreement has evidently been amicably settled and the count's relatives are now here to witness the ceremony. Mgr. Michael J. Lavelle, rector of St. Patrick's cathedral, will officiate. There will be no civil or Protestant ceremony.

Boston, Mass., Jan. 16.—Demands that they begin employment have been made upon Mayor Hibbard and Governor Guild by thousands of unemployed men in Boston, organized by Morrison Swift, formerly an "officer" in Coker's army. Meetings of the unemployed have been called in various parts of the state.

J. H. Adams, a farmer living near Novelty, King county, Washington, was bitten in the throat by a vicious horse Saturday afternoon and died two hours later from the loss of blood.

**Many Patients.**  
Dr. John M. Semple, superintendent of the eastern Washington hospital for insane at Medical Lake, reports 571 patients on hand December 1. There were 11 admitted during the month, one discharged and 50 deaths.
