Ordinance No. 371, Series 1908. An ordinance to license, tax, regulate and restrain the sale of malt, vinous and spiritous and other intoxicating liquors in bar rooms, saloons, drinking shops and any other place or places in the City of La Grande, or provided for in this ordinance and to repeal ordinance No. 8, series 1890, entitled "An ordinance providing for licensing bar rooms, saloons and drinking shops, and to restrain and regulate the sale of malt, vinous and spiritous liquors."

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. No person or persons shall, in the city of La Grande, Oregon, directly or indirectly, in person, by agent or otherwise, sell, barter or deliver or permit to be sold, bartered or delivered for, or on his or their account or at all, any vinous, spiritous or malt or other intoxicating liquors, whether they be drunk on the premises owned or occupied by him or them, or otherwise, or shall sell, barter, or deliver in any manner, such liquors or any intoxicating liquors, within said city, without first obtaining a license therefor in a manner hereinafter provided. And every person to whom such license shall be granted, shall first pay into the city treasury of said city of La Grande, the sum of \$1000.00 per annum, in advance, when said license is granted for a full term of one year; provided that a license may be granted under this ordinance for a period of less than one year, but not for less than six months, at the rate of \$1000.00 per annum.

Sec. 2. Any person wishing to sell spiritous, vinous, malt or other intoxicating liquors of any character, within the city of La Grande, Oregon, except a legally authorized druggist, must first file a written petition with the city recorder setting out the term for which he desires a license to so sell such liquors, the place and character of the business, where he proposes to sell such liquors, together with the receipt of the treasurer of the city for the amount of such license, together with a bond signed by not less than two good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by the council at the meeting thereof where such license is granted, which petition, receipt and bond must be considered by the council which shall first find that the petitioner is a suitable person to be licensed to sell such liquors; and, second, that the place and business to be carried on where such liquors shall be sold under said license shall not in any way, by example, or otherwise, inconvenience the public or endanger the morals of

said city; third, that the petitioner will be likely to perform the conditions of his bond; and, fourth, that the council believes that in so selling such liquors at said place, the petitioner will not during the term for which the license is to be issued, violate any law of the state of Oregon, or any ordinance of this city, and for any of the reasons above set forth, the council shall have the right, and it shall be their duty, to refuse to grant or issue a license to any applicant or petitioner.

Sec. 3. That if upon the filing of such petition and the payment of said license fee a majority of all the members of the council present, shall approve said petition, and the petitioner shall file, and the council approve a bond for such license in the following form, then said license shall issue, to-wit:

KNOW ALL MEN, BY THESE PRESENTS, That _____ as principal, and _____ as sureties, are held and firmly bound unto the city of La Grande, Oregon, for the use and benefit of said city of La Grande for which said principal and sureties are held and bound by the conditions of this bond in the sum of \$2000.00, lawful money of the United States for the payment of which sum well and truly to be made to said city, we, each of us, jointly and severally bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this _____ day of _____ 190...

The conditions of this obligation are such that whereas the above bounden _____ has this day made application by petition for a license to sell spiritous, vinous, malt and other intoxicating liquors on the premises known as the _____ in the city of La Grande, Oregon, under the provisions of ordinance No. 371, series 1908 of said city, which license is about to and will issue upon the order of the common council of said city, it is expressly understood that as a condition of this bond that we and each of us are held and firmly bound to pay the full amount of \$2000.00 to said city of La Grande, in case said _____ shall violate any of the conditions of said ordinance No. 371, series 1908, and in case said bounden _____ should be convicted of violating any of the provisions of said ordinance it shall be the duty of the city attorney and the city recorder, and that they shall have the right to institute suit to collect the full amount of this bond for the use of the city of La Grande.

Oregon. Now, if said _____ shall keep an orderly house, and in all things comply with the provisions of said ordinance No. 371, series 1908, from the date of the issuance of said license, permit no gaming or riotous conduct in or about the place or premises wherein said liquors shall be sold under said license; and that he will not open or permit to be open his place of business for the purpose of traffic, delivery or the giving away of any intoxicating liquors, on the first day of the week commonly called Sunday, or between the hours of one and five o'clock a. m. on any day of the week; that he will not give, sell, supply or deliver spiritous, malt, vinous or other intoxicating liquors to any minor or minors or habitual drunkards during the term of this license, then this bond shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

city jail of not less than 75 days nor more than 150 days, and if any person or persons shall fail, neglect or refuse to pay such fines, then he may be ordered by the city recorder to be confined in the city jail not to exceed one day for every two dollars of such fine, and any person or persons convicted of the violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall forfeit his license and it is hereby provided that it shall be in the discretion of the council to cancel such license or to allow it to remain in full force and effect, and this may be considered at any regular meeting of the council.

Sec. 5. All the provisions of ordinance No. 8, series 1890, of La Grande, Oregon, entitled, "An ordinance for licensing bar rooms, saloons, and drinking shops, and to restrain and regulate the sale of malt, vinous and spiritous liquors," approved September 13th, 1890, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

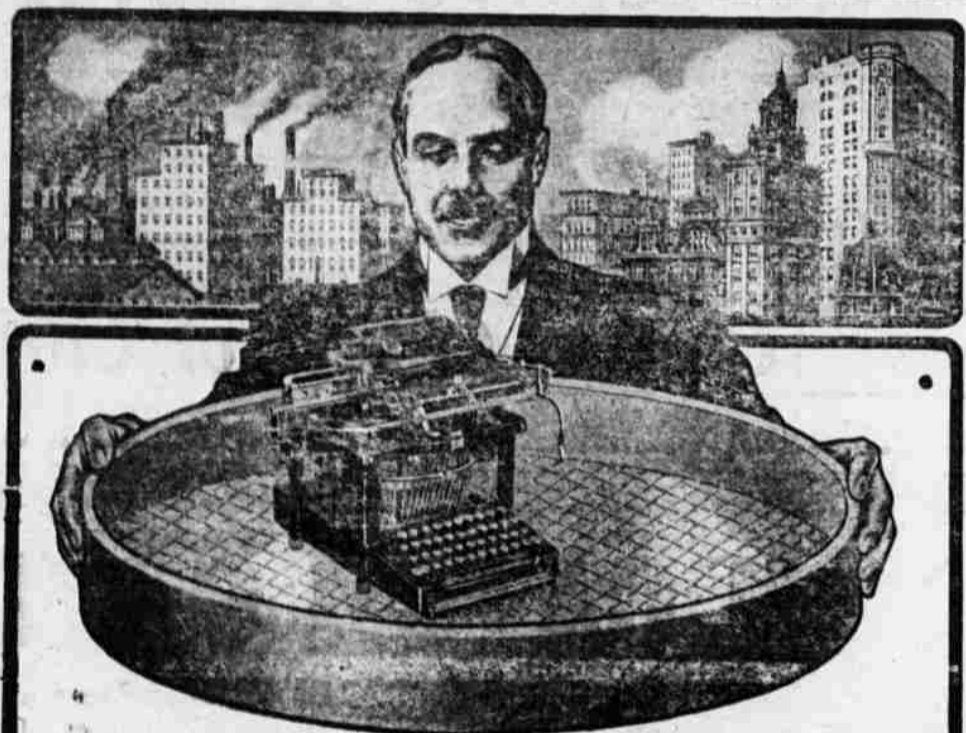
