# ENGINEEMEN WANT RAISE

Enginemnen on the Harriman lines of the northwest are said to be awaiting with considerable concern the outcome of a meeting to be held by the management of the various roads in the system at San Francisco in a few days, says the Spokane Chronicle. General Superintendent M. J. Buckley of the Harriman Oregon lines, will be present at the conference, which has as its object the definite announcement of an increase in wages of the engineers and firemen, says a Portland report. The matter came up late last year at a meeting at which were present general representatives of all lines west of Chicago, and at that time it was decided that the enginemnen were entitled to more pay, but the exact amount and other details were not fixed upon. Other meetings have been held since then and the time now seems ripe for the reward the men have been waiting for so long.
