When Judge Galloway opens court In this city on January 20, he will have the disposition of the two largest sults ever brought of late years in which the state is a party-the cases of the State against Dupbar and Kincald, former secretaries of state, one of whom is sued for the re-

The suit against F. I. Dunbar was commenced soon after his term of orfice expired, in the name of one Sears of Polk county, who sued on behalf of himself as a citizen, and all others. After the suit was begun, the supreme court held in the case of superintendent of the state prinson, that a private citizen cannot maintain this kind of a suit. (See 47th Ore., page 50.) Attorney Mc-Mahan of Salem, who brought the cul for Sears, then changed his complaint to State of Oregon, plaintiff, upon relation of District Attorney John H. McNary, who consented to be substituted as a party.

Motions and demurrers will be argued Monday, but it is expected the ease will be set for trial on its merits, and an accounting will be ordered for the eight years of the Dunbar administration. The money sought to recovered was collected from diers persons for fees, fines, commissions, emoluments and perquisites attacking to that office by various methods and, it is claimed, in violation of the constitution, all that amount above \$150 per year and the salary allowed for serving on various state boards, being involved.
