WALLA WALLA SELLS BONDS

"Attorneys will approve bonds when city passes ordinance which is forwarded today.

"E. H. ROLLINS & SONS."
Walla Walla's \$100,000 city hall and fire station bond issue will be taken by the Chicago firm of bond buyers, according to the telegram received by City Clerk T. D. S. Hart last night, says a Walla Walla paper. When the representative of the bond company was here about a week ago he bid in the issue at par, subject to the approval of the company.

The only thing necessary now is the passage of the ordinance, which is simply adopting the form of the bonds, and this will probably be done next week, as soon as the copy is received from the eastern firm.
The Rollins company bid in the issue before, but their attorney turned the issue down on the grounds that the bonds were illegal. The supreme court, however, decided a short time ago that the bonds were all right, and now Rollins & Co. bid them in again. This time they announce that they will take them.
City officials are greatly pleased with the receipt of the telegram and the information it contained, as this means that there will now be no hitch in the erection of the city hall, the fire station having been completed.

GIBBS BUYS HOTEL.

Timber Cruiser of La Grande Owner of Improved Hostelry.

Although Pendleton is now supplied with four of the largest and best hotels in the inland empire, still further hotel facilities are now being added to the city.

W. S. Powell and W. C. Gibbs, the timber cruiser formerly located at La Grande, proprietors of the Bowman hotel, are now adding a dining room on the lower floor of the Bowman building in which family tables will be set and meals served three times a day.

An entrance is being cut from the Main street stairway into the dining room, and there will be two other entrances cut, one from Railroad street and one from the west end of the dining room inside the building.

The third story of the Bowman will also be fitted up at once, giving the house a total of 90 rooms, the lobby will be greatly enlarged and other improvements will be added to make it a first-class hotel. The patronage of the Bowman is now highly satisfactory and the new proprietors have faith in the future of the city and will at once fit up the entire building. The third story containing 40 rooms, has never been fitted up.

Bonds All Ready.

At the council meeting last night an amendment to the old bond selling ordinance was passed and all details preparatory to the big \$135,000 sale have now been completed. The first payment, one of \$50,000, is to be made March 1 and thereafter the company has the privilege of paying \$25,000 to the city monthly or paying the entire balance at one time should it desire. The city receives interest on the deferred payments and the bonds are to be dated January 1.
