## EIGHTH GRADE PERRY ITEMS EXAMS TAKEN

Yesterday was eighth grade examination day throughout Union county and when Superintendent E. E. Bragg reached his office this morning he found the advance budget of papers awaiting grading.

At this early date it is impossible to even guess at the number which will be promoted to the high school. This is partially responsible to the fact that students have three opportunities of being promoted. Those who have finished a part of the eighth grade curriculum could take examinations in those particular studies yesterday, and if successful, the credit will be given when the May or June examinations occur. In the event that failures result, the student has two more chances of making good. Thus it will not be possible to give the exact number of promotions from the county rural schools until after the June exams.

About 50 papers covering either complete or partial examinations were written yesterday, and grading is being done on those turned into the county office today, by the county superintendent and Miss Syra Kuhn.
