ENGINE IN LOCAL SHOPS

The logging engine at the George Palmer lumber camps beyond Elgin, has been more or less wrecked and is in the local shops for repairs.

Lou Rayburn, superintendent of track construction at the camps, is in the city during the time that the engine is being repaired, and if all goes well, he will return to the woods tomorrow or perhaps not until the next day.

Nearly four miles of track have been laid, construction work having only recently ceased. When the foot or more of snow disappears, additional steel will be placed.

There are 75 men employed at the camps at present. Those who were detailed to the loading department have joined the cutting gang since the engine was put out of commission.

MILLER IN SPOKANE

Harry Miller, of Miller & Draper, who are arranging the local Elks' minstrel, has gone to Spokane, where he will stage a large minstrel performance on Thursday of this week. Mr. Miller has had three irons in the fire while working in La Grande, but none have been neglected. FILE PAPERS AT SALEM

Judge J. W. Knowles has filed with the secretary of state his declaration of intention to become a candidate for the republican nomination of circuit judge of the Tenth Judicial district, at the primary election to be held April 17. He announces as his declaration of principles that, if elected, he will faithfully and impartially perform the duties of the office, and that he favors a rigid enforcement of all laws.

POSSIBLE CANDIDATE.

L. J. Davis of Union, May Run for Circuit Judge.

When asked about the report that he would be a candidate at the republican primaries for the nomination for the office of circuit judge, Hon. L. J. Davis of this city, said:

"It is true, I am being urged by many of my friends to enter the race, but I have not given the matter serious consideration. Of course, judicial honors are something to which most attorneys who love their profession, aspire, although the elevation to the bench of a successful practitioner is frequently made at a considerable sacrifice, financially. Yet, should it appear that it is the desire of the people that he serve them in a public capacity, an attorney, like other citizens, is confronted with a duty that he cannot properly avoid for mere financial reasons. If I were satisfied the party wanted me as their candidate and that I could be of some assistance in carrying the party to success, I might enter the race. However, I have not yet given the subject serious consideration to give you any definite reply at this time."—Union Scout.
