# DISCUSSING NEW COURT

To talk over the matter of the creation of a federal district for eastern Oregon, a committee from the Citizen's league of Baker City came down to Pendleton today and this afternoon has been engaged in discussing the matter with Pendleton attorneys and business men, says the Pendleton East Oregonian.

The committee consists of Samuel Baer, Fred G. Mellis, James A. Howard and B. E. Kennedy, and they represent the citizens of Baker City in this most important matter.

The object of the conference is to discuss the situation in regard to the creation of the proposed federal district and to see if some definite and satisfactory conclusion may not be reached by which all of eastern Oregon will be benefitted in the matter.

Pendleton and Baker City being the two contestants for the honor of being headquarters for the district, are both ably represented in congress in the matter and it is the object of the meeting between citizens of Baker City and Pendleton to arrive at an amicable and satisfactory arrangement by which a bitter fight over the location of the headquarters and the selections for the district may be prevented in congress.

The matter of creating a federal district for eastern Oregon will undoubtedly be settled at the present session of congress. Senator Fulton has already introduced a bill in the senate providing for headquarters at Baker City and Congressman Ellis will introduce a like measure in the house naming Pendleton as headquarters and it is hoped that by conferring with each other and discussing the entire subject from a broad and unselfish standpoint that the rival cities can avoid any bitterness of feeling and that the result of their conference may be for the best interest of the entire eastern Oregon section which is vitally concerned in the matter.

### OREGON CLIMATIC CONDITIONS.

The Orange-Judd Farmer Compiles the Following.

**Klamath County**—Most of the range stock have been driven in and winter feeding has commenced. Stock is in better condition than usual, with plenty of grain and hay for all purposes. The stock market is weaker all around. Beef cattle and hogs declined about 1 cent. Horses have dropped 15 to 20 per cent. Butter and eggs in good demand.

**Jackson County**—Stock of all kinds living on the pastures, with the fields still green. The amount of grain sown this year is about the usual acreage, all of which is in fine condition. Climate very mild and exceedingly healthy.

**Lane County**—Weather mild, even for this country. Some rain, but fair weather most of the time. Grain looking finely. Some fields of early sown fall grain 8 inches high and as green as June. Stock wintering well. Feed high, \$19 per ton for hay, oats 40 cents per bushel, bran \$22 per ton. There is a slight advance in the price of fat hogs, in fact, all fat stock are in demand. Hop market demoralized. Great interest in planting fruit trees, such as apples, pears, cherries and some peaches; also some walnut trees.

**Lincoln's Mother Made Him Dress Up.**  
The February American Magazine contains a full account of Abraham Lincoln's birth and boyhood. It is related by Dennis Hanks, who was Lincoln's cousin and playmate. Hanks, now dead, gave all the facts to Mrs. Eleanor Atkinson of Chicago, who now publishes them for the first time. Here is what Hanks reports about Lincoln's mother making him "slink up."  
"She seemed to know Abe had more pride'n the rest of us. He always had a extra pair o' jean pants an' a white shirt. When he was only 13 Aunt Sairy sez to him, 'Abe, you git hold o' some muslin some'ers an' have some white shirts, so you kin go to folks' houses right.' So he cut nine cords o' wood an' got nine yards o' unbleached cotton, an' she bleached it an' shrank it an' made him two shirts. He put one o' them on every Sunday. Maybe Abe wouldn't 'a' been the man he was if it hadn't ben for his mother an' stepmother encouragin' him."
