## FIND CORPSE IN OLD HUT

An unknown man, probably a tramp was found dead in a deserted cabin about half a mile from Bingham station yesterday, says the Pendleton Tribune.

Coroner Folsom was notified early in the afternoon and went to the scene last evening on No. 2. An investigation revealed the fact that the man had died from natural causes so no inquest was held, the body being brought back by Folsom on freight No. 23.

The first report was to the effect that the man was found rolled up in a blanket, frozen stiff and the impression was that the fellow had frozen to death during one of the cold nights of the latter part of last week. A complete investigation indicated he had been taken ill and had crawled into the cabin and died.

The dead man was about 60 years of age, had no papers or other means of identification upon him. His identity will probably never be known.
