ENGINE GOES TO ALBINA

Division Foreman J. H. Watson returned this morning from Umatilla, where he went on a brief business visit yesterday, and reports today that freight engine No. 366 has been sent to the Albina shops today for repairs. This is the engine in which the crown sheet fell yesterday, seriously scalding Earl Hough, a brakeman running out of this city. Hough was taken from Echo, where the accident occurred yesterday morning, to St. Anthony hospital at Pendleton, where he is now recuperating. The engineer and the fireman escaped uninjured. In fact, so fortunate were they that their clothing was not even saturated with the escaping steam.

Railway Companies Will Help

The great Transcontinental Railway companies have been quick to recognize the importance of the session of the National Irrigation congress which will be held at Albuquerque, N. M., September 29-October 3, 1908. Conferences have already been had with a number of these, notably the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe, the Denver & Rio Grande, the Rock Island and the El Paso & Southwestern.

W. J. Black, passenger traffic manager of the Santa Fe system, writes to the board as follows: "Referring to our conference today in reference to the co-operation of the Santa Fe company in making the next National Irrigation congress at Albuquerque a marked success. Instructions have been given to include editorial mention of the Irrigation congress in each edition of 'The Earth' between now and October. We will likewise carry a display advertisement in the Earth. We also propose to issue 30,000 or more copies of an illustrated folder or pamphlet describing the attractions of the congress and other subjects of interest for distribution in localities interested in irrigation, with the idea of increasing the attendance at Albuquerque in October. We will furthermore aid the people of New Mexico in such ways as can be devised in the interim in making the Albuquerque convention one long to be remembered. We shall of course, expect your assistance in preparing data and copy for the folder and for any further suggestions which will be of mutual advantage to all concerned.

You may also be assured that we will at the proper time arrange for favorable excursion rates to Albuquerque. Passenger rates throughout the eastern territory are in such a chaotic condition at the present time that it is impossible for me to definitely determine at this writing what can be done from that particular section. So far as I can see now there will be no complications from the extensive irrigated districts of the west from which a large majority of the attendance will come. Yours truly,
