BIG LEAGUE MEN TRAINING

New York, Feb. 18.—Down at Marlin Springs, Texas, today the final preparations are being made for the reception of the minor league recruits of the New York Giants, the first of the major league teams to begin the annual spring migration to the sunny southland. By the last of this week it is expected that all of McGraw's new men will be warming up, preparatory to a strenuous try-out at biffing the ball, base running, fielding and battery work. The old-timers among the Giants will not arrive at the camping grounds until about 10 days later.

A few weeks more will find practically all of the major league players and aspirants quartered in various cities and towns of the south, from Savannah to Los Angeles.

Of the 400 or more players that will be taken to the various training camps scattered below Mason and Dixon's line, probably 80 or 100 will be practically disposed of by the time the bell rings on April 14. Some will go to pay ground rent for the use of the training camps, while many will either be turned back to the teams they played with last season or be released to some club, which has a manager capable of developing the players in question so that they will be ripe for the big leagues in another year.

All but one of the major league clubs will train in the southland. The one exception is the Chicago American league club which will get in its preliminary stunts in California, and which will later hit the south for numerous exhibition games.

Of the national league teams, Chicago will train at West Baden and Vicksburg, New York in Texas, St. Louis in Houston, Pittsburg at Hot Springs, Cincinnati at St. Augustine, Fla., Philadelphia in Savannah, Brooklyn in Jacksonville and Boston at Augusta, Ga.

The American league players will be divided as follows: New York in Atlanta, Cleveland at Macon, Ga., and New Orleans, Chicago in Los Angeles, Detroit in Hot Springs and Little Rock, Philadelphia in New Orleans, St. Louis in Shreveport, La., Washington in Galveston and Boston in Little Rock.

LABOR WAR IN CHILE

Valparaiso, Feb. 17.—A disastrous labor warfare, which may result in the bloodiest revolution in South American history, with the red flag of anarchy as the standard of the revolutionists, now threatens Chile. The administration of President Pedro Montt has been admittedly in the interests of the capitalists, and the feeling of revolt among the laborers is rapidly gaining in strength and ferocity. Hundreds of men have been shot down like dogs by the soldiers of Montt, and the anarchist agitators have taken advantage of this bloody warfare between capital and labor to extend their propaganda throughout the industrial communities of the republic.

The troubles culminated disastrously to the miners at Iquique toward the end of the year, when at Lagunas there was an encounter between the troops employed by President Montt to preserve order and the strikers, when seven men were killed and many wounded. The strikers, who numbered 30,000 men, had tied up all work at Antofogasta, Mejillenes and Calleta Bura. In December another bloody encounter occurred, in which 219 men were killed and 50 wounded.
