A Pasco item says: Traffic on this division of the Northern Pacific is steadily increasing. The number of freight trains operated out of the Pasco headquarters has almost doubled in the last three weeks. There is much coal and lumber being shipped, which accounts in a large measure for the increase in business. The Northern Pacific also is preparing to put up its ice along the road in this part of the state, which will call for a still further increase in trains while it continues.
