NEW LADDER
FOR LADDIES

The La Grande fire department is to be equipped with one or two Pommer ladders in the near future. This is a simple yet effective device for scaling buildings. Its construction is such that a boy can carry it, and yet, a fireman can climb to the roof of any building no matter what the height. It is a stout but light pole, equipped with hooks which are used as steps, and has a large hook on one end which can be anchored in a window sill on a roof or any other projection of a building. Its average length is 12 feet and in this way the firemen can reach the top of a building by anchoring the ladder in each story window.

The ladder has been ordered by Chief Jones on recommendation of a committee from the department, and should be in use before many weeks. It will be attached to the hose cart and wherever the hose cart goes there will always be a ladder in ready reach of the firemen.

Open New Railroad.

Baton Rouge, La., Feb. 24.—The Baton Rouge, Hammond & Eastern railroad, an Illinois Central line, was opened for traffic today between Baton Rouge and Covington, a distance of 67 miles. The road has been under construction for the past year and may eventually be operated as part of the Illinois Central system, and when the entire line is completed the distance between Memphis and Baton Rouge will be shortened over 100 miles from the present route by way of New Orleans.
