**EVIDENCES OF PROSPERITY**

The lumber industry is rapidly regaining normal conditions throughout the northwest. We noted several pages devoted to items like the following, which we have clipped from The Timberman, which is one of the largest trade journals on the coast:

Extensive repairs are being made to the Grande Ronde Lumber company, Perry. The logging road is in operation.

Stanley-Smith Lumber company, Hood River, will probably resume operations at its plant about the first of April.

Patterson Lumber company, Rainier, is operating its plant steadily, largely on cargo orders, three cargoes having been dispatched in January.

The new plant of the Cody Lumber company, Bandon, recently began operations. The plant has a capacity of 600,000 feet in 10 hours, being equipped with modern machinery throughout.

The Sorenson Logging company, Iverson, Ore., recently sold a raft of 31 logs, scaling 222,500 feet, or 4166 feet to the log. The logs were delivered to the Finke Cooperage plant, Brookfield, Wash.

Inman-Poulsen Lumber company will shortly commence the erection of a new, modern planing mill. The dimensions will be 70x200 feet. Five hundred horsepower upright engine will be installed to drive the mill.

Oregon Lumber company, Baker City, has installed a lighting system in its sawmill at Austin. This plant is operating steadily. New offices have been built at the Baker City plant. The structure is of brick, handsomely finished with native woods.

North Pacific Lumber company, Portland, has in operation their new Allis double-cutting band. The mill is running steadily and is averaging about 250,000 feet daily. Manager W. B. Mackay spent some time in California recently, taking a general survey of conditions.
