## DELEGATION IS NOT NEEDED

That a delegation to Washington could do but little good at this time for the new federal district bill is stated in a letter just received by a Pendleton man from Congressman Ellis. The letter in full is as follows, says the East Oregonian:

Washington, D. C., Feb. 21, 1908.  
 Hon. T. C. Taylor,  
 Pendleton, Oregon.

My Dear Mr. Taylor: I received your telegram in due time in regard to the federal district bill and since its receipt have been making inquiries among the members of the committee to which the bill was referred.

As the matter is at present I do not feel that I would be justified in asking you to send a delegation here. However, you may rely upon me to give information should an occasion arise wherein I think a delegation can assist in this matter. Of course I would be more than pleased to have a delegation of Pendleton citizens here in order that they might fully understand the situation and to aid me in any way possible to bring about a favorable consideration of the measure; but in view of all the circumstances, I do not feel it would be the proper thing for me to request their presence at the present time, but should after developments bring out the necessity for the presence of the delegation you will be promptly informed. ### Guess Size of Ballots.

A report from Salem says: With the filing of the last of the arguments upon initiative and referendum measures yesterday, it has become possible to compute approximately the size of the pamphlets for information of voters. S. A. Koser, chief clerk of the secretary of state's office, today measured the material to be included in the book, and concluded that the copies of bills, amendments and arguments will occupy 120 pages at least. The cost will be about \$50 per page, or \$6000. As persons who file arguments must pay their proportion of the total, about \$2850 has been paid by private individuals.

### Copy for Each Voter.

The pamphlets will be published and ready for distribution about April 1, or two months before the people will be called upon to vote upon the measures. Secretary of State Benson is now securing lists of voters who have registered in each of the counties of the state and has clerks at work addressing envelopes to these voters. When the pamphlets have been printed they will be slipped into the envelopes and mailed.

State Printer Duniway will try to save the state \$1000 in postage by shaving the pamphlets a little close on the edges when he trims them. It is expected that the postage on each pamphlet will be 5 cents, or \$5000 on the whole 10,000 copies. Mr. Duniway thinks that by trimming the pamphlets to a slightly smaller size than the law specifies he can make them light enough to go for 4 cents each.
