GROWING IMPATIENT.

Baker City Restless Over Delay in Passing Federal Court Bill.
Waiting with a wonderful patience people of eastern Oregon have been lenient and fair with the delegation in congress relative to the federal court bill, but the time is now approaching when something must be done or members of that delegation suffer criticism which is sure to follow, says the Baker City Herald.

Congressman Ellis is apparently listening to the pleadings of Pendleton to have her name substituted for Baker in the bill. He has already announced that such a thing would jeopardize the bill's success, yet reports from Washington that have never been denied state Ellis' position as favoring Pendleton with strenuous effort.

Voters in this section won't stand for having the bill held up until after the primaries are held. They have been worked on that scheme before by politicians and they do not propose to let the game of politics interfere with what should be their rights, if they can help it. All admit it is within the power of Senator Fulton and Congressman Ellis to hold this matter up, but at the same time almost every voter registers himself as being in favor of a show-down before the April primaries are held. It is certainly up to the delegation to make good in this matter, and do it now. Fulton will suffer at the polls by a merciless public if he cannot show a clean bill of health on this measure after it left his hands in the senate. They will accuse him of merely introducing it as a vote catching proposition, along with bills for La Grande and Pendleton to receive appropriations for public buildings. On the other hand, if he gets the bill through, he will hold support that otherwise will not think of staying with him.

A Steward Attraction.

The Los Angeles Herald under date of Monday, January 6, had the following to say of "The Toymaker," the comic opera which Frank W. Healy's San Francisco Opera company will present at the Steward soon.

This is "Old Home Week" at the Los Angeles theater. Members of the San Francisco Opera company arrive home again yesterday morning and last night more people turned out to welcome them than could find seats in the theater. For the first time on record the Los Angeles was sold out. The opera presented was "The Toymaker," originally done in the car under the more cumbersome title of "The Toymaker of Nuremberg." It is a light, frothy, frolicsome affair. There is plenty of fun, a considerable number of pretty girls in attractive costumes and a chorus.

The foolery of "The Toymaker" is sufficient to make you forget its good music; and if there were nothing else than the dainty work of Gene Omond, the opera still would be worth the while. Gene during the greater part of the time she is on the stage is impersonating a mechanical doll that can walk, sing and talk in jerk doll fashion. A role better suited to this diminutive comedienne could scarcely be imagined and she over looked none of its abundant opportunities.
