The presiding officers receive. therefore, \$5 per day or \$200 for the session. The mileage amounts to 15 * nomination for county commiscents per mile traveled. A member from Portland receives \$15.90 as mileage. A member from Jackson county receives about \$83 mileage, a member from Baker county \$122, and one from Curry, \$146 as mileage. The mileage allowance more than pays traveling expenses for one trip, but members from western Oregon countles and from eastern Oregon counties along the railroad usually make two or three trips home during the session, so that their mileage is more than used up. In the past members as a rule have traveled upon passes. so that unless they had to travel on stages or steamboats their nifleage allowance was practically additional compensation.
