Darrow to Defend Friend.
Warren, O., March 5.—When Alford Kinsman, a wealthy resident of Kinsman, this county, faces a jury this month to answer to the charge of slaying George Birrell, he will have as his leading counsel Clarence Darrow, the famous Chicago attorney who successfully defended Haywood and Pettibone, the western labor leaders. Darrow and Kinsman were schoolmates, and although the distinguished attorney is still suffering from the illness that sent him from Idaho to Los Angeles for treatment, he has promised to come to the defense of his former companion. Birrell is alleged to have been killed by Kinsman as the result of a quarrel over the settlement of the estate of the latter's father, of which Birrell was trustee.

Ice Men Prepare for Season.
Kansas City, Mo., March 5.—Serene in the confidence that the back of winter has been broken and that summer is on the way, the dealers in frozen water in all parts of the west assembled in Kansas City today for the tenth annual session of the Western Ice Manufacturers' association. The convention will last three days and will be largely devoted to a discussion of the ice business in all its phases. Nearly 250 manufacturers in the west and southwest are members of the association. President E. R. Andler, of Sedalia, Mo., is presiding.
