MANY NEW OPERATORS

The nine-hour day for telegraph operators is now in force on the O. R. & N., and today J. L. Whitney of Portland, the extra operator for the Pendleton office, will begin work under the new federal law. His shift will begin at 6 p. m. and end at 10 p. m., and is known to railroad men as the "split trick," says the Pendleton East Oregonian.

Alfred Noth is the regular night operator and ticket clerk and will work from 10 p. m. until 8 a. m., and R. L. Jackson, day operator, holds what is known to railroad men as "the gentleman's job," from 8 a. m. until 6 p. m.

It is now estimated that 20 extra operators will be employed on the mountain division of the O. R. & N. between Umatilla and Huntington. One extra operator will be employed at each of the following places: Umatilla, Echo, Pendleton, Bingham Springs, Duncan, Huron, Meacham, Kameia, Hilgard, Union, Telocasset, North Powder, Baker City, Pleasant Valley and Durkee, while at La Grande and Huntington more than one extra man will be necessary. The new nine-hour law will increase the salary bill of the O. R. & N. on this division about \$1500 per month.

Work on O. R. & N. Bridge April 1.
Work on the O. R. & N. bridge across the Grande Ronde river at the mouth of Wallowa will begin April 1, is the report in Elgin, says an Elgin item. The authority quoted is an official of the railroad company, who is in a position to know what he is talking about. Many signs point to an early resumption of work on the Wallowa extension of the O. R. & N. The gang of Japanese laborers below Elgin has lately been reinforced by a lot of dagoes. Engineer R. I. Long, who came through Elgin Saturday, states a surfacing gang was sent down that day to work on the track between Looking Glass and the mouth of the Wallowa. The presumption is this gang will put the track along there in shape for running of construction trains over it.
