JACOBS BUYS RANCH.

Former La Grande Man Buys Real Estate in Arizona.
The Arizona Blade of Florence, Ariz., says:
Fred Jacobs and Charles M. Foreman closed a deal this week whereby they are now owners of what is known as the "15 ranch," with the entire band of cattle, numbering between 400 and 500 head. The purchase was made from H. W. Reynolds and A. F. Neighbors. The 15-ranch and range is located in the Belle canyon, 15 miles east of Florence, about four miles from the Gila river, and on the north side. It is reputed to be one of the best ranches in this section of Arizona and has one of the best herds to be had anywhere. The country embraced by this ranch and range is fairly dotted with springs and the feed is always good there when other sections are suffering for lack of it. In all, it is a safe investment and Messrs. Jacobs and Foreman are to be congratulated on securing so valuable a property. Charles Foreman needs no introduction here, being well known as a cattleman and owner of a fine ranch and range with several hundred head of cattle in the Black mountains, about 30 miles southeast of Florence. Fred Jacobs is a recent arrival, having come here about two months ago from La Grande, Ore. His reputation as a shrewd and successful business man, however, preceded him here, and this in connection with the knowledge of the indomitable spirit, leads us to be speak for him a record of pronounced success in the cattle business here before coming to Arizona he conducted a large mercantile establishment at La Grande, Ore.

BANK TO REOPEN.

North Powder Defunct Bank Reorganized and Will Open its Doors.
The North Powder News contains the following official notice, which tells its own story, and is a bit of interesting news to Union county financiers:
We wish to inform the depositors of the Farmers & Merchants State bank, insolvent, that the Powder Valley State Bank of North Powder, has been incorporated with new capital, and, if approved by the state bank examiners, will be authorized to open for business within 30 days from the 14th day of March.
The new bank will then purchase sufficient assets from the insolvent bank, with the approval of the court, to pay all depositors in full.
When this transfer is completed and the depositors are settled with, the incorporators of the new bank will proceed to nationalize the bank with a paid-up capital of \$25,000.
The state bank is incorporated first in order to give the depositors in the insolvent bank a settlement in full for their claims at as early a date as possible, as it will take about 70 days to get the national charter.
We wish to thank all claimants for their patience in this matter, and ask that you will bear with us a little longer, and all will be paid.

Notice of Street Improvement.

To Whom it May Concern:
Notice is hereby given that by a resolution duly passed, the common council of the city of La Grande has ordered the following described portions of the street hereinafter named, to be improved by constructing cement sidewalks on and along the same as follows: That a cement sidewalk seven feet wide be constructed on Depot street from its intersection with Fourth street to the south line of the Mahaffey brick building; also a cement sidewalk seven feet wide on Fourth street along lot 4, in block 103, in Chaplin's addition to La Grande; also cement sidewalks, 12 feet wide, along lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 9, in block 108, and on the east side of Elm street, from Washington avenue to Adams avenue; also along the north side of Adams avenue, from Chestnut street to Fourth street; and along the west side of Fir street, from the north side of Jefferson avenue to the south track of the O. R. & N. Co.
All of said walks to be built at the expense of the owners of the property abutting on said portions of said streets according to the specifications of ordinance No. 307, series 1905, and under the supervision of the street commissioners, and to be completed not later than July 1, 1908.
Notice is also given that any of said work and improvement not done by the property owners by said July 1st, will be done by the city and the cost of doing said work made a lien on the property abutting on the street so improved by the city as aforesaid. That any remonstrance against said improvements or any part thereof, must be presented to the city recorder within 10 days after the date hereof.
