**CLOW MAKES MESS OF IT**

A. W. Clow athletic instructor at the Walla Walla schools, has brought a rupture in athletic relations between Pendleton and Walla Walla, as far as interscholastic sports are concerned. Mr. Clow refereed the basketball game in this city recently, when the Garden City team defeated the Gobblers. His work here was not of a high order by any means, but it did not reach the point it did at Pendleton on the evening following, according to the following from the Pendleton East Oregonian:

At a meeting of the students of the Pendleton high school yesterday afternoon all athletic relations with the Walla Walla high school were declared off until the Walla Walla school removes their present physical director, Clow.

Clow was the official during the recent basketball game with the Walla Walla high and the Pendleton students still remember him for his unfairness on that occasion. Also, they resent statements made by him in interview with a Walla Walla paper. Preparations for the track season are now being made and Walla Walla is seeking a meet with Pendleton. But this they will not get unless they let Clow go.

The following resolutions upon the subject were passed yesterday:

Knowing that the conduct of Mr. Clow, athletic director for the Walla Walla high, who while acting as referee in the basketball game between the Pendleton high school and Walla Walla high school February 27, was ungentlemanly and unbecoming a referee and that he made certain false and malicious statements concerning members of the high school faculty in the course of an interview to a Walla Walla paper; be it

Resolved, That we, the associated students of the Pendleton high school, sever all interscholastic relationships with the Walla Walla high school, as long as the said Mr. Clow is in any way employed by that institution; and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be spread upon the minutes of this association; a copy be forwarded to the principal of the Walla Walla high school, and a copy published in the Hakawinn.
