Mitchell, head of the United Mine- of, the plaintiff will take judgment to order the last national convention interest thereon at the rate of 10 per over which he will preside, and one as the most important. The delegates will consider the grave situation resulting from the fallure of the operators and miners of the central comtion to call a joint convention to re establish the interstate wage agree ment and adopt a scale of wages. The convention will adopt a policy to be pursued after March 31, when the present wage scale expires, and probably will decide upon its wage demands for the next two years.

There probably will be only three The first will be to proceed at once to frame the wage demands, and having completed that task, to issue a call for a joint wage conference between operators and miners of Indiana, Ohio, Western Pennsylvania and Illinois, opening the door to any or all operators who wish to sign the scale demanded and put their mines into operation. The second proposition will be to draft wage demands and issu calls for joint wage conferences with the operators by districts. The third proposal will be to shut down all of the mines in one big strike, and thus try to force settlements by competitive districts.

A strike means a long, lasting fight with the operators and if the miners win they will demand much more than they intended to ask had an interstate conference been held now. A suspension merely means that the men will await the operators' pleasure before the starting of the mines.

Ugly charges about the motives of the operators in refusing to convene with the miners are being made.

President Mitchell openly declares that the action of the operators appears to mean that they are trying to stimulate a sagging coal market. "They are doing this," said President Mitchell, "by either talking or making us strike or they really intend to make us strike."

A statement issued by President Mitchell says:

"It is a source of keen regret to me that the coal operators have refused to respond to the overtures of the niners to hold an interstate confernce for the purpose of trying to adest wage relations prior to the expiration of the present contract. It appears to me that there will be a uspension of coal mining in the cen-

ral competitve fields on April 1. The ilners have made repeated proposiurpose of reaching an agreement. The situation to me looks very seri-

A strike would mean that 212,000 men would quit work, 160,009 of these eing in the central competitive field.
