Timber Companies Oppose Tax.
The representatives of the Grande Ronde Lumber company and the Crosssett Timber company, have refused to pay the special road tax levied in districts 14 and 18. In district 14, a special road tax of 10 mills and in district 18 of 8 mills was levied. The tax made about \$1000 difference in the taxes of the Crosssett company, and about \$150 in the Grande Ronde company's taxes. This they refused to pay. They tendered the amount of their taxes, less this special tax to the sheriff's office last week, amounting in all to about \$3,700, and piled the coin, to the very cent, on the desk, but upon the advice of the district attorney and the county court, the money was refused on the grounds that it did not cover the full amount of taxes.—Wallowa Sun.
