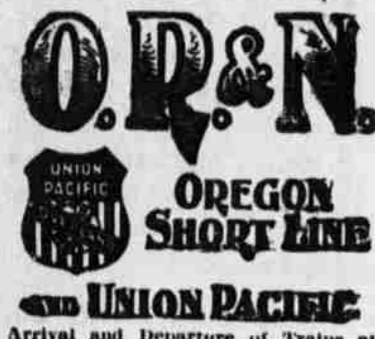

CHINAMEN CREMATED.

A Long Death List Follows Fire in Marysville, California.

Marysville, Cal., March 12.—A fire which gutted a building in the heart of Chinatown today, resulted in the death of six Chinamen, four men and two boys. Heavy iron gratings became redhot and refused to open, thus barring the escape of the victims, who were roasted to death before the eyes of the crowd, which was powerless to aid the doomed men.

New Jersey Methodists.

Millville, N. J., March 12.—Local Methodists have complete arrangements for the entertainment of the delegates to the state conference of the church, which will convene here tomorrow. Delegates will be elected to the general conference, to be held at Baltimore in May. Former Governor Stokes is expected to be one of the lay delegates.

BANK REORGANIZED.

Papers of Incorporation Filed With County Clerk Today.

Papers of incorporation by the Powder Valley bank have been filed in the county clerk's office. This is a reorganized banking institution which did business in North Powder recently. The incorporators in the reorganized bank are H. O. Gorham, W. J. Cavinder and S. Vandecar, all of North Powder. They hold shares of \$100 each, as follows: H. O. Gorham, 80; W. S. Vandecar, 10, and W. J. Cavinder, 60. The bank is capitalized at \$20,000 and will resume its business in North Powder soon.

PROHIBITION CONVENTION.

Anti-Saloon Men Will Meet in Portland on March 27.

The state convention of the prohibition party will be held in Portland on March 27, according to dodgers distributed about the city today. The notices call for every prohibitionist in the state. The convention will meet at the First United Brethren church at 9 o'clock.

Railway Men to Meet.

Chicago, March 12.—Presidents, vice-presidents, general managers, superintendents, chief engineers and other officials of leading railway systems in the United States, Canada and Mexico will congregate in Chicago next week for the convention of the American Railway Engineering and Maintenance of Way association. The sessions will open on Tuesday and will occupy three days. Delegates are expected from South and Central America and Europe.

Stockmen in Fort Worth.

Fort Worth, Texas, March 12.—Hundreds of additional visitors arrived today to inspect the National Feeders' and Breeders' show, now in progress here. The judging of cattle, horses and mules was continued this morning in the great arena at the coliseum.

California Y. M. C. A.

Long Beach, Cal., March 12.—Representative members of all the Young Men's Christian associations of California arrived today for the state convention, which will extend through four days. "The Relation of the Y. M. C. A. to the Extension of the Kingdom on Earth" is the keynote of the program.

OUTFITS TO RIPARIA

The large number of outfit cars that have been stored here this winter, have been transported to other points. The last of the cars were sent to Riparia this morning, when No. 23 took 11 outfit cars west.

A large number of this class of cars have been stored on the unused tracks of the local yards ever since the re-tronching orders last fall, but during the present year, as construction work has been resumed here and there, small batches have been sent out occasionally. The train today took out the last of them.

UNION COMPANY INCORPORATED

Former La Grande Man in Union Mercantile Company.

The Union Supply company, a firm composed of Union business men, has been incorporated and papers to that effect are filed with County Clerk Gilham today. The incorporators are F. P. Hammond, H. J. Lucas and W. J. Hanks. The purpose of the incorporation which is capitalized at \$25,000 is to conduct a general mercantile business at Union.

Program Changes Tonight.

The Brewers will give a second performance of their four nights' stand. The opening performance, under local management, was given at the Noyes rink last night. The crowd, though small, was pleased. The singing is especially good, and a larger crowd is looked for tonight. There will be a change in program each night until the troop has completed its contract of a four nights' stand.

Boni Denies Charges.

Paris, March 12.—Following the calling of Mme. Gould for America on the steamer Adriatic yesterday with her two children, Count Boni de Castellane today issued a statement stating that she did so with his consent and that recent statements to the contrary were forgeries issued by de Sagan to create sentiment against the French "count."

Undersold Competitor.

Cleveland, March 12.—A feature of the hearing of the government suit against the Standard Oil company, being tried here today, was the testimony of J. Sheaf of Syracuse, Ind., who detailed the manner in which the Standard agents spied upon him and his business, and finally broke him by underselling.
