### WOMAN'S PARK CLUB.

Ladies of Walla Walla Meet and Organize.

A large number of enthusiastic ladies met at the club room in the public library yesterday afternoon and completed the organization of a Woman's Park club, says the Walla Walla Bulletin.

The club is known as "The Woman's Park Club." The object of this organization is to devise ways and means for securing a permanent park fund for maintenance and for the acquiring of other park lands; to take an active interest in beautifying one's own neighborhood. To encourage the planting of school grounds and vacant lots, etc., and to aid the park commission in its efforts to make Walla Walla the city beautiful.

The organization is a permanent one, that will live and prosper, aid and encourage in every possible way anything that tends to make this the most beautiful city in the northwest.

The members will make a canvass of the city and expect to have by Saturday a list of 1000 members to boost the park movement.

A meeting will be held at the Commercial club rooms Saturday at 2:30, at which all wishing to aid the park cause will come or send their names.

### Seduces His Own Daughter.

A. P. Vance, who has resided in Hood River valley for several months on the McEwan farm, was arrested in The Dalles the latter part of the week on a warrant sworn out by his father-in-law, charging him with cohabiting with his 13-year-old daughter.

Mr. Vance came to the city Saturday and took the local train to the county seat to attend to some business matters, and as he stepped off the train, was arrested and lodged in the county jail.

He confessed the crime to Sheriff Chrisman and Attorney Menefee, stating that these relations had existed for several months.

When arraigned before Judge Bradshaw he pleaded guilty of the charge and was sentenced to the penitentiary for 20 years.
