PAYS HIGH PRICES.

The Blue Mountain Creamery Co. Pays High Price for February Butter Fat.

The Blue Mountain Creamery company paid 33 cents per pound for butter fat for the month of February. This is the highest price ever paid in this valley by this company, and the present creamery management is glad that their butter market for February was such that they were able to pay this price. That they are striving to pay their patrons the highest price for their butter fat that their market will justify, is a fact.

A great many people do not realize the amount of business done, or the amount of money disbursed monthly to its patrons. To give an idea of general information of the creamery business at this time of year, we state the following facts:

The creamery received during the month of February 10,177 pounds of butter fat, for which it disbursed to its patrons, at the rate of 33 cents per pound, the sum of \$3,358.41. During January and February, there is less cream received than during any other month. During the months of May, June and July the monthly payroll to the patrons amounts to more than \$6000. One can readily see that the amount of business done and the amount of money disbursed yearly, are not small items.

Below we give a list of a few patrons, number of cows milked by each, the number of pounds of butter fat, and the amount of pay check for February:

J. W. McCallister, 8 cows, 142.21 lbs butter fat, 33c per lb; total \$46.93.

A. Wilkinson, Union, 9 cows, 157.50 lbs butter fat, 33c per lb; total \$51.97.

F. Ratz, Union, 8 cows, 154.06 lbs butter fat, 33c per lb; total \$50.83.

J. Kohler, Union, 8 cows, 154.09 lbs butter fat, 33c per lb; total \$50.84.

G. M. Baker, Cove, 9 cows, 127.22 lbs butter fat, 33c per lb; total \$41.98.

H. C. Reese, Cove, 8 cows, 114.67 lbs butter fat, 33c per lb; total \$37.84.

Fred King, La Grande, 8 cows, 3410 lbs milk, at 15c per gallon; total \$51.15.

Considering the cost of shipping and the loss of cans, 33c per lb for butter fat is equal to the highest price paid by any outside creameries. As to the question, whether or not dairymen pay, consult the above named gentlemen.
