## UMATILLA LOCAL OPTION

A working committee of 120 voters, or three from each of the 40 voting precincts in the county, was organized at the court house last evening to have charge of the local option campaign in this county this spring, and the question of county local option will be placed upon the official ballot for an expression from the people.

Although the matter has been agitated for some time nothing definite had been done until last evening when about 25 friends of local option met at the court house and named committees from each precinct in the county to have charge of the campaign and petitions were sent out asking that the question be submitted to a county vote.

An active campaign will be carried on and friends of the movement are enthusiastic over the outlook. There are now five local option precincts in the county, to-wit: North and South Milton, South Athena, Ruddock, Pilot Rock, Helix, Weston and Adams, it is said, aside from the county vote.

### North Bank Irrigation Scheme.

Word has been received here that T. B. Montgomery has sold three sections of unimproved lands, including the townsite of Roosevelt, on the north bank road, to a Seattle syndicate, says an Arlington dispatch, for \$50,000. Plans are being formed to build a dam across Wood Gulch, thus forming a reservoir sufficiently large to irrigate the entire tract of land sold, and also adjacent land equally as good. When these plans are successfully carried out and the land divided into small tracts and sold to settlers who will transform the desert into comfortable homes, it will result in the building up of the towns of Arlington and Roosevelt, as it will bring a good trade to both places.
