TAFT, HUGHES AND JOHNSON

New York, March 16.—Gathered about the same banquet board as the guests of the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, Secretary Taft, Governor Hughes and Governor Johnson of Minnesota will deliver addresses in New York tomorrow night.

The dinners of the Friendly Sons are non-political and it is said that the speeches of Johnson Taft and Hughes will be without political significance. Yet for all that Governor Johnson while in the city will talk over the democratic national situation with democrats. Governor Johnson has adhered steadfastly to his utterances of the last six months that he was not a candidate for the democratic nomination for president. He supported Bryan in the two campaigns of 1896 and 1900 and Judge Parker in 1904.

To Hear Big Copper Suit.

Trenton, N. J., March 16.—In the court of chancery tomorrow, on application of counsel for Albert S. Bigelow, of Cohasset, Mass., a hearing will be granted on the order to show cause why the Old Dominion Copper Mining & Smelting company should not be restrained from further prosecuting suits to recover judgments rendered against Bigelow in the Massachusetts courts. The judgments are for \$1,213,566 and \$832,160.

The bill of complaint alleges that Bigelow and the late Leonard Lewishohn of New York, were the persons who acted as promoters to arrange for the purchase of a large amount of property for the Old Dominion company for prices grossly in excess of its value, and it is claimed that they should be held accountable for the profits wrongfully received.

The Massachusetts courts decided against Bigelow. The United States circuit court for New York held that the company could not recover against the estate of Lewishohn, and an appeal was taken to the United States supreme court.

Texas Roads Fight Law.

Austin, Texas, March 16.—According to advices from the clerk of the United States supreme court, the test case of the Galveston, Harrisburg & San Antonio Railway company, a Harriman line, against the state of Texas, will probably be submitted this week. This is the case in which the railroads of the state are seeking to test the constitutionality of the act of the 29th legislature, known as the Love bill, levying an occupation tax on the railroads, measured by their gross receipts, and upon its decision hangs the question of whether or not the state of Texas will collect amounts aggregating nearly a quarter of a million dollars.
