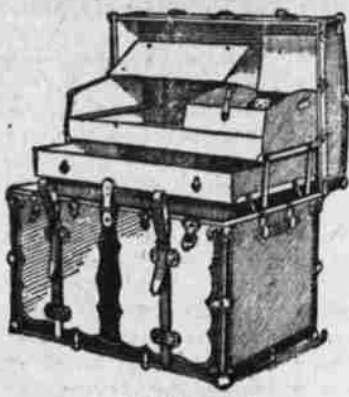
HANFORD TONIGHT.
