ISLAND CITY WILL ENTER

The Island City track team will enter the Walla Walla meet this year. Last season the management at Walla Walla refused to allow the team to contest, as it had no past record to corroborate its statement that it was fit to compete with the best in the land. Since making creditable showings at Corvallis and in the eastern Oregon meet last summer, the Walla Walla managers have seen that Island City is entitled to representation. This will be the opening track event of the season for the suburbans, as it is for the La Grande team.

Thus another eastern Oregon team will enter the arena for hours among the high schools of the northwest.

No Tickets in Seattle.
The Harriman lines have withdrawn from passenger business in Seattle and hereafter no tickets will be sold by these lines from Seattle to eastern points or over the Southern Pacific until such time as the new extension of the Union Pacific establishes its western terminal in Seattle.

The withdrawal of Harriman from the Seattle field is due to the recent decision of the interstate commerce commission, which makes it illegal for any railroad to sell tickets over a line with which it has no tariff concurrence agreement. The action of the Northern Pacific, which is the only outlet from Seattle to Portland now the western terminal of the Harriman lines, in declining to concur or rates, is the basis for the decision of the commission.

Being barred from competing for through business, Harriman has also decided to cease the sale of tickets over the Southern Pacific from Seattle, although the decision of the commission does not affect that route. The expense of handling this business will be left to competing roads, while the Southern Pacific will continue to enjoy the same profits, as there is no through competitive fare to the south.

Lands Famous Prisoner.
Francesco Cheddio, charged with dynamiting a hotel at Niagra, West Kootenay, B. C., arrested recently at Salt Lake City, and being extradited by the Canadian government, is now lodged in the Umatilla county jail.

He is in charge of Chief Constable W. J. Devin, who is taking the Italian back to Canada for trial. They came in yesterday on No. 1, which was to take for them to make connections with the Spokane train and they were compelled to accept the hospitality of Sheriff Taylor over night. They will leave on the noon train for Spokane, and the north.

Cheddio is supposed to have blown up the hotel several months ago. One person was killed and another injured by the explosion.

Following the tragedy the Italian skipped out and had been chased over a large part of British Columbia and the United States when he was lured into the very gates of the prison at Salt Lake and arrested. This happened a few weeks ago and the intervening time has been consumed in fixing up the extradition papers.—Pendleton Tribune.

Will Play La Grande.
Two games of indoor baseball are being arranged between the Enterprise and La Grande teams to take place at La Grande Wednesday and Thursday, March 26-27. It is reported that the La Grande team is a strong one and the boys from here are expecting the hardest fight in their history when they cross bats with the "beet pullers." However, La Grande will know they have been in a game should they be victorious over the Enterprise boys, as there are some fast men on the team and they work well together. La Grande will pay the expenses of the visiting team.—Wallowa Chieftain.
