## INDIANA DEMOCRATS FOR WM. J. BRYAN

Indianapolis, Ind., March 24.—Democratic leaders and members of the state central committee are gathering in Indianapolis today in advance of the state convention, which will be held tomorrow and Thursday. It is certain that the Hoosier delegation to the Denver convention will be pledged to Bryan. The platform will probably include a local option plank and will demand law enforcement, temperance legislation, insurance reform, home rule and other reform measures.

Owing to the fact that Bryan is to be endorsed and will dictate the national platform, it was decided to confine the Indiana expressions almost entirely to state issues, but tariff will be advocated and trusts denounced.

Many of the county conventions, at which delegates to the state convention have been selected, have declared in favor of John W. Kern for vice-president, and there is no doubt that the state convention will instruct for him if he will permit it. The members of the committee are for him and believe his nomination possible, but Kern has not indicated that he cares for the party endorsement.

The early date of the state convention is thought to favor the gubernatorial candidacy of Samuel M. Ralston of Lebanon, who is a close friend of National Chairman Taggart. It is apparently a safe guess that Ralston will be nominated and that delegates favorable to the retention of Taggart as national committeeman from Indiana will be sent to the Denver convention. These delegates will be selected by delegates to the state convention at district meetings held in Indianapolis on the eve of the state gathering.

The designating of early convention dates was a victory for Taggart and for Ralston, who is Taggart's choice in the governorship race.

**New Postoffice in New York.**  
Washington, March 24.—Plans will be opened tomorrow for the new post office building in New York. Eight of the leading architects of New York have submitted competitive plans. The judges who will pass upon the plans are James G. Hill of Washington, Henry F. Hornkastele of New York city, E. M. Wheelwright of Boston, and Frank Miles Day of Philadelphia. Thirty-four of the leading architects of the country have been requested to submit plans under the same act for the new public building at New Orleans. Nine of the architects have offices in New Orleans. None of the 34 is in the competition for the New York postoffice building.
