A PIONEER IS DEAD

Mrs. Sabre Hopper, mother of Joshua Hopper of this city, died near Pendleton yesterday morning. Mr. Hopper, however, has been at the bedside for some time, and is now in Pendleton, where he will remain until after the funeral.

Mrs. Sabre Hopper, Umatilla county pioneer woman, and grandmother of a host of people in this city, died at her home in Nolin at 6 o'clock this morning from the effects of illness brought on by old age.

Mrs. Hopper was a native of Tennessee and was born on December 20, 1835. She was therefore more than 92 years of age at the time of her death.

With her husband, Mrs. Hopper crossed the plains with an ox team in '65, and the family settled at Nolin, where they have lived permanently ever since and where Mr. Hopper died.

Four sons and two daughters of the deceased are now alive and mourn her end. They are Nowell Hopper, Joshua Hopper, Bura Hopper, Thomas Hopper, Mrs. Jerry Barnhart and Mrs. M. A. Terry.

Aside from the sons and daughters the pioneer woman is survived by 67 grandchildren and a number of nieces and nephews. Among the granddaughters are Mrs. T. B. Swearingen and Mrs. William Baker, Tracy Baker, the high school student, is a great-grandson.

During her long residence here the deceased became well known to all old residents of the county and especially to those who came to the county in the very early days.
