**ED CROSS
TO CHICAGO**

E. M. Cross, formerly a brakeman of La Grande, chairman of the adjustment committee of the brakemen of the O. R. & N. system in Oregon, Washington and Idaho, left this evening for Chicago, where he will represent the trainmen in a hearing with Harriman officials on the subject of tying up train crews away from the terminal stations, causing them to remain away from their homes for long periods.

The matter has been under discussion for some time and has finally assumed serious aspect and a hearing has been fixed for April 1 in Chicago, when it is hoped that it may be adjusted.

Since the 14-hour law went into effect in Oregon and other states the companies have made a practice of tying up the crews in the middle of a run, when the hour limit expires, thus causing much dissatisfaction and friction.

Under the 14-hour law the companies claim this is the only alternative, while employees contend that lighter trains should be handled by which they could reach the terminal before the expiration of the hour limit.

Mr. Cross has been to Chicago in the interest of Oregon brakemen before, and is considered a capable representative.—Pendleton East Oregonian.
