Logs Commence to Come and Mills Will Start Next Week.

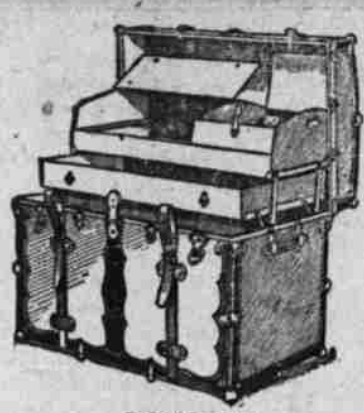

Fort Worth, Texas, March 27.—Responding to the call of the Bailey campaign committee, Texas democrats who have remained true in their allegiance to the Texas senator will assemble here tomorrow to endorse Bailey as a candidate for delegate at large to the Denver convention. The committee calls attention to the fact that Senator Bailey did not announce as a candidate for delegate until his enemies had declared that he should not be a delegate, and that his sole reason for entering upon the campaign was to meet the test of strength which his opponents had prepared.

Hanging Day in Missouri.

Jefferson City, Mo., March 27.—Next Friday, April 3, will be hangman's day in Missouri, the supreme court having fixed that date for the execution of three men. The convicted men are: William Jeffries, St. Charles county, for killing a person in attempting to commit robbery; Frank Daly, alias A. C. Biles, of Kansas City, for the murder of Robert Harvey by giving him poisoned whisky in St. Louis; John Baker, a negro of Boone, county, for killing a negro and killing two others while shooting at a fourth.
